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Engaging Albertans - groups, organizations, business, governments and individuals - in strategies and policy creation to ensure secure access to adequate amounts of safe, nutritious, culturally appropriate food for everyone, produced in an environmentally sustainable way and provided in a manner that promotes human dignity.





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The Overall GFSA Goal

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To create a province-wide Food Security Network that:

- Fosters awareness of Food Security and Food Sovereignty,
- Builds Capacity,
- Creates strategies and policies to address the 5 A's of Food Security and the six pillars of Food Sovereignty
- Effectively uses a logic model evaluation approach

And builds economic, social, natural and human capital and invests in economic, social, sustainable and human development (Hancock, 2003)

What is it?

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Food Security is everyone's business and includes the circle of....

Planting, growing, hunting, fishing, harvesting, transporting, shopping, preparing, eating, and preserving our environment

AND



Equity and Choice at every pointered



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Growing Food Security in Alberta (GFSA) has come to understand food security as the satisfaction of **five** components:

RELATIONSHIPS

- Availability -> sufficient supplies (local preferred) of healthy food for all people at all times farming, hunting, fishing, gardening,
- Accessibility → physical and economic access to food for all at all times - hunting, fishing, farming gardening, cooking and preserving
- Acceptability

 culturally acceptable and appropriate food and distribution systems that are environmentally sustainable
- Adequacy → nutritional quality, safety, sustainability of available sources and methods of food supply that are environmentally sustainable
- Action > ensuring the social and economic infrastructures are in place to enable action that will ensure the previous four elements of food security. Adapted from Rod McRae"

Additionally GFSA has embraced Asset Focussed Community Building values and strives to achieve Food Sovereignty.

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Food Sovereignty Broadening Food Security

Equitable assess to food AND extending respect and appreciation to food providers, traditional knowledge, cultural differences and nature.

The language of food sovereignty as opposed to food security is explicit about food citizenship, that people and communities assume responsibility in maintaining healthy relationships within our food

systems

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Why Food Sovereignty? and What about Food Security?

The heart of food sovereignty (FS) is reclaiming decisions-making power in the food system. This means that people have a say in how their food is produced and where it comes from. FS seeks to rebuild the relationship between people and the land and between those who grow and harvest food and those who eat it. The vision of a just and sustainable food system is anchored in achieving 6 interlinked Pillars of Food Sovereignty.



Food and shelter costs unaffordable for low & minimum wage earners

- family of four earning a low income
- single parent female of two children earning a low wage


Low and minimum wage earners struggle

- Wages main source of income of 56% of Canadian households who are food insecure
- 27% of Alberta households using food banks report employment income as their primary source of income
- 64% of individuals making less than \$12 per hour are women
- Mothers will often go without food in order to feed their children





- 5. Localizes food systems
- 6. Puts control locally
- 7. Sacredness of food

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RELATION SHIPS

Peoples Food Policy Project

Develop a grassroots movement on Food Policy that will put pressure on the federal government. It is based in the principles of food sovereignty and will provide the framework and an enabling environment to foster a just and sustainable food system here in Canada and abroad.

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130 Albertans Speak! 7 Policies submitted for the PFPP ->

RELATIONSHIPS

- 1. Create a national Food Sovereignty body at arms length to the government
- 2. Legislation -preserve/value small farmer/providers includes trade agrmts
- 3. Change health/food safety regulations to accommodate small scale providers, encourage local food systems, and foster food sharing neighbour to neighbour, backyard sharing, etc.
- 4. The Genuine Progress Indicator be implemented in place of the Gross Domestic Product as a comprehensive measure of progress in Canada
- 5. Full disclosure food labels, carbon footprint, GMOs, country of origin of growth and processing and traces of compounds used in the storage, transporting and production"
- 6. Universal Food Literacy Education schools, families and the public
 - 7. Provide incentives, economic and social supports for the development of equitable local food systems which would also preserve the environment."




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
